
















Sleepover Club Highlights

COVID Vaccinations Clinic

A walk in children's covid clinic will be held at **Cannock Fire Station WS11 6LD** on **Sunday 15TH January 2023 between 10 and 14:45.** This includes first dose, second dose and autumn boosters to those children between the ages of 5 and 17 **ONLY** if they are eligible. For bookings and queries, please contact 12-15covidimms@mpft.nhs.uk

"Your child is eligible for 1st or 2nd dose if:

- They are aged between 5 years and 17 years (had to be 5 years old on or before 31st August 2022)
- Have not received a Covid vaccination before
- If had a 1st dose needs to be 12 weeks before 2nd dose (8 weeks if Clinically vulnerable)
- Have not had Covid 19 infection within last 12 weeks (28 days if clinically vulnerable

Your child is ONLY eligible for an autumn booster if:

- Aged 5 years and over are clinically vulnerable and had last vaccine 91 days or 13 weeks prior
- Aged 5 years and over and live with someone who is immunosuppressed** (see table below) and had last vaccine 91 days or 13 weeks prior
- Young Carers between 16 and 17 years defined as those who are eligible for a carer's allowance, or those who are the sole or primary carer of an elderly or disabled person who is at increased risk of COVID 19 mortality and therefore clinically vulnerable
- If your child meets the above criteria and has not had Covid in the last 28 days if clinically vulnerable or within last 12 weeks"

Staffordshire Safeguarding Board have brought to our attention an abhorrent and dangerous online game accessible through some social media sites.

The game is named "A game" and is being circulated via Facebook to children. It contains several different actions for them to complete, including the encouragement

of self-harm and hurting others. This is a screenshot of how the message has been appearing on Facebook:

Around the country there have been incidents where dares via social media have led to dangerous incidents and even death in some circumstances.

We work hard to educate our children to keep them safe online, particularly those who are independent online and I am sure you will want to work with us to ensure that they apply their knowledge and understanding to any games on social media.
